- Formulated survey questions for questionnaires administered to the parents of child participants.
- Analyzed data using Statistical Package for the Social Sciences (SPSS) Software, demonstrating lead exposure in 70% of child participants, and finding statistically significant ($\alpha = 0.05$) associations between children's proximity to mine, health risk behaviors, and sociodemographics.
